Re: FAA's Proposed SID Procedures OROSZ 3 and SLAPP 3

Dear Mr. Elwell,

The Studio City Neighborhood Council supports Congressman Brad Sherman, Councilman Paul Krekorian, Assemblymember Adrin Nazarian and Los Angeles City Attorney Mike Feuer's request that the FAA perform the highest level of environmental review, an Environmental Impact Statement.

The above referenced procedures will require that all departing jets cross GPS waypoints in Studio City and Sherman Oaks, thereby forcing them to fly over elevated terrain, traversing the Santa Monica Mountains between Studio City and Encino, and over many Public Parks and other Section 4(f) noise-sensitive resources in the Santa Monica Mountains.

Our stakeholders oppose these procedures, as well as the undisclosed, unauthorized, and unstudied RNAV and vector-guided Next-gen jet path that started in 2017.

We reject the FAA's claim of Categorical Exclusion, a claim that there will be no environmental impact and therefore no need to perform environmental review as it is based on an artificial baseline. FAA has an obligation to perform the highest level of environmental review, an Environmental Impact Statement.

Further, in order to provide time for adequate public review, we support the LA City Attorney's request that the FAA extend the period for comment to February 16, 2019.
